The app can be used to log all reading at home and it shows if it has been logged by the child themselves or by the parents/carers. In school, we will be using the app to log reading too, so parents will be able to quickly see when children have been heard reading and any focus points for them to develop with their child. We hope that the children will then be able to use it to share their reading journey with their peers and the adults around them.
