At Stoke by Nayland C of E Primary School we promote British values in the following ways:

Democracy

- Elected School Council with members from all year groups, providing a pupil voice
- Foundations of democracy learned through historical legacy (e.g. study of Ancient Greece)
- Class rules set by all
- Learning about our system of government

Rule of Law

- Behaviour Policy in place which focusses on children taking responsibility for their actions
- PSHE lessons give opportunities to explore the reasons for rules and take an active part in setting boundaries to the benefit of all
- Learning that all actions have consequences and how laws may reflect Christian values
- Learning that the rules of the land apply equally to everyone, whatever their position

Individual Liberty

- Learning about the right to be free from discrimination and bullying
- Freedom to develop individual potential and be creative in learning
- The freedom of opinions, expression and association

Mutual Respect

- Assembly/Collective Worship programme allows many opportunities to explore and learn about respect and friendship
- PSHE, Literacy and other subject areas allow scope for discussing and debating different points of view

Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs

- RE curriculum allows scope to learn from and through the main religious faiths, looking for similarities and celebrating differences between those of faith and those of no faith
- Cultural days to learn about countries, faiths, art and music etc.
